“ My Mom

One of the first memories I have of my mom is waking up early in the morning laying in bed next to her and her whispering while playing hand bunnies so that we didn't wake up anyone else in the house. She would play with me til I would start getting excited and she couldn't keep me quiet any longer and then we would get up for the day once I had woke up my sister or my dad.

I remember her doing laundry and letting me come outside with her while she would hang the laundry outside on the lines she had on our porch. I can see her hanging it with the sun shining bright against the back of her dark hair. I loved running through the big sheets after she hung them.

I remember one time she and I were the only two home and she played hide and seek with me. It was one of my favorite games to play. It was her time to hide. I couldn't find her and I kept calling for her but she wouldn't answer me. I started crying and calling for her through tears but she didn't answer. Then I heard noise coming from the front door I ran to it finding my dad returning from work. I cried I had lost mommy! I turned around and there she was and I asked her why she didn't come when I called her and she said I was supposed to find her.

She was always busy, cleaning, cooking, reading, studying she was always learning new things and figuring out how to do things. She loved puzzles and quandaries. She loved to try and fix things. She made clothes for my sister and I and crocheted hair ties and doilies and blankets. She would teach herself new patterns, and recipes. When I was really young I didn't know we didn't have much because she worked so hard to make sure we had everything we needed. She was creative and artistic and she was good at problem solving. I remember her cutting and folding cereal boxes to make doll furniture for me and Jennifer. One of my favorite things was when it was bed time and she would make getting in bed fun by letting me run under the sheets while she fanned them high in the air then she would wrap me in tight. She would try and get me to take naps and I wouldn't want to so she made a game where I would have to knock her out and then squeeze her nose to wake her back up. Eventually

I couldn't get her to wake back up by squeezing her nose and then I would get bored and fall asleep too. She was a wonderful mother. I know I was a challenge in many ways for her but I never had any doubts that she loved me.

She was a very compassionate person, for people and animals alike she was always a protector for our cat from me. I remember many times her having to tell me to put the cat down because she knew I was making him miserable. He learned quickly she was his ally and would try and stay close to her. She loved that cat, Tim. His death made her heart hurt like she had lost a family member. She told me stories of a dog she had as a kid named Mugssie. I don't remember them all but I do remember her laughing at how he was so smart that he would chew chewing gum and stretch it with his front paws. Once she tried nursing a baby bird back to health after we found it fallen out of its nest. She was crushed when all her efforts failed. I remember coming home from school and asking how the bird was and she cried that it had died.

She was always putting herself out for other people. Her friends knew she and my dad could be relied on when they had a need. She loved nature and being in nature. She loved to take hikes and to camp and sit outside and look at the stars. She loved planting a garden and reaping the benefits. I remember one time she was hiking in the wooded area behind the house on Rutland and there was an apple tree that had ripe apples that had fallen on the ground on an incline but there were a bunch of yellow jackets in the area because of all the apples that had started to rot. She had picked several apples and had them held in her shirt but there was one more she saw that looked really good just past some rotten ones with a lot of yellow jackets. She slipped and got stung, lost a bunch that she already had and learned a lesson. It was in that same area she discovered a natural honey tree and told one of her brothers about it and someone came out and moved the nest somewhere else. She taught me, my sister and my dad about different wild, native to this area plants that could be eaten while we would hike like, honey suckles, black berries, mulberries, persimmons, Poke stalk, dandelion and Paw paws.

She loved music, I remember her cleaning house and playing

country music while she cleaned. She taught herself how to play some songs on the keyboard and she loved to sing even if she was the only one who loved it.

She made herself available not just her time and energy but her heart and kindness was always offered too. She would run friends to the grocery store or to the doctor or do an errand for them even if it was inconvenient to her.

She was one of the most loyal people I have ever known, she loved my dad through all the hard and bad times along with all the good and fun ones. She is missed. I love you mom!
