May 16, 1916 - February 5, 2012

On May 16, 1916 in Talladega, County, Alabama the chimes of time rang out the news that Beulah Mae Thomas was born, a daughter of the late Charlie and Mary Thomas. At a young age she moved with her family to Cleveland, Ohio where she received her early education in the Ohio public school system.
